## Lacamas Lake Drawdown Extended Until January 31, 2018

**Camas, Wash.** – Georgia-Pacific’s Camas mill will begin the Lacamas Lake drawdown on Monday, September 18 for the annual inspection of the dam.

Usually this process only lasts a few weeks; however, this year due to ongoing work by the City of Camas on the North Shore Sewer Transmission System project, at the request of the city the lake level will remain low until January 31, 2018 or until work on the city’s project is complete.
